
Dear Families,

#### JUNIOR NEWS

A reminder that Term 1 is a hat term and all students must have a hat on to play outside during recess, lunch and sport ("NO HAT, NO PLAY"). If you could please ensure your child's hat is clearly labelled, we would greatly appreciate it.

#### PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Thank you to all the families that came along to parent teacher interviews last week. It was wonderful to meet with everyone and discuss your children and their learning needs.

#### FOUNDATION - LITERACY

Students have been singing alphabet songs and doing activities that involve rhyming words, syllables, beginning and ending sounds in words and substituting parts of words (eg. changing bedroom to bedtime). The letters and sounds we have learned are /s/ and /a/. The students have been enthusiastically identifying these letters and sounds in our everyday routines. Students are also learning to read decodable books and write the letters /s/ and /a/. It is amazing to see how fast this learning is happening!

#### MATHS

In maths we have been learning to count individual quantities and count two quantities 'altogether'. Students have been modelling this with blocks and counters. They have practised with card games and outdoor group activities. Students have been doing rainbow tracing to practise the number formation.

#### BLUEARTH

In Bluearth sessions we have had a focus on motor skill and balance. Students have been doing bilateral movement exercises such as cross over walking, figure eight walking and changing directions.

#### **INQUIRY**

Students are demonstrating their geographic learning by using directional language and identifying places on the world map. We have been reading Jeannie Baker's 'Window' book and making our own maps with photographs from the story. This learning has transferred into LETI where students are working on independent projects such as making volcanoes erupt, fairy garden maps, mermaid and unicorn maps, airport maps and army maps.



#### RELIGION

In religion we are learning about what makes us special. Students have made posters about themselves using magazine cutouts that show what makes us all individual.

#### YEAR 2 - LITERACY

We've had another great week, lots of learning about Australia with our class text 'Are we there yet?' by Alison Lester. This has brought up some interesting and funny stories about camping trips and road trip holidays. We've looked at vocabulary from the book and wrote about our own special places we've visited. Next week we move onto our new class text 'A Year On Our Farm' by Mel Hunter.



Our spelling program is up and running with new word lists going home on a Monday in our spelling homework booklets. We expect words to be practised each night along with home readers and returned to school on Friday morning to be checked. Students have activities glued on the inside cover of their booklets they can use for different ways of completing their homework. This week's focus is /ew/ as in few.

Home reading is off to a great start and we'd love to see this continue. Students are expected to change their readers when arriving at school and read with a teacher if it is their news day however ALL students are welcome to join in for before school reading from 8:30am.

#### MATHEMATICS

We have been getting our Essential Assessment completed this week and working on our Place Value up to 1000 and beyond, counting by 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s, and review the months and seasons of the year. If you like to practise at home here are some links:
