

Child Safe Officer Role Description

The Child Safe Officer is a person responsible for promoting and maintaining a child-safe environment in St Mary's Primary School. The role of a CSO involves implementing and monitoring child protection policies, procedures, and practices in the school. The CSO works with school staff, students, parents, and external agencies to create and maintain a safe and nurturing environment for all children.

Specific responsibilities:

- 1. Implementing and reviewing child protection policies and procedures in line with the Victorian Child Safe Standards and other relevant legislation and guidelines.
