
#### BOOK FAIR

# **FOUNDATION**

The Foundation students continue to amaze us with their knowledge and learning. We have been orally creating sentences, taking "boring" sentences and making them better by adding features such as who/when/where/why. This is a fantastic activity you can also recreate at home.



It creeps.

Changed into:

The wild cat creeps towards the river in the reeds to catch some fish.

It barks loudly.

Changed into:

My dog Dough barks loudly every day because he is hungry.

In addition, check out their amazing independent writing, using a picture as a guide.



#### YEAR 1

In Maths the students are learning about fractions. In the curriculum, students learn to recognise and describe one half, as one of two equal parts of a whole. This has been a fun topic to learn about, as all students were unfamiliar with fractions.

After a lesson or two, students made the following comments:

'A quarter is a full square cut into four triangles.' - Mavis

'If you had two friends over for dinner and you had one whole pizza, you will need to cut it into two halves.' - **Tom** 

'I learnt in maths today that a numerator goes at the top.' - Ed

'Quarters are four pieces of pizza.' - Lewis

'I have learnt in maths today that a whole can be cut into two halves and a half can be cut into two quarters.' - Molly

In writing, students have been learning about 'conjunctions' BUT, SO and BECAUSE. Students are learning to recognise where they need to put a comma, mid-sentence, when they use a conjunction. Conjunctions are used to expand simple sentences, to add more information. Students have also been practising where to use a comma when writing about multiple items or ideas i.e., a list.

In reading, students have been listening to and learning about History. Some of the historical topics we have read about in picture books are Queen Victoria, the First Australians, the Titanic, the Goldrush and Sydney Harbour Bridge. As a whole group, we have been learning about the Geographical location of Australia, and how it has changed since the first inhabitants 50,000 years ago. Students have looked at maps and globes, to see where different cultures that live in Australia have migrated from. A focus in this type of reading is 'vocabulary'. Students identify unfamiliar words and as a group, we research the meaning of the words and the origins of the words i.e., the word 'chauffer' is a French based word for 'driver' (French based words have the /ch/ that make a 'sh' sound).



All of the above learning is used in LETI/Inquiry to create work that shows our understandings.

# WANGARATTA ART GALLERY VISIT - FRIDAY, AUGUST 18TH

We were very excited to receive a letter from one of the artists featured in the Wangaratta Art Gallery Textiles awards. The children will be creating some textile work based on the art of Evangeline Cachinero. After contacting her, we received this lovely email back on Monday:

Dear St Mary's students,

Greetings! I hope you're all doing well. I'm excited to hear that this week you'll be learning about art!

I wanted to share something special with you. It's about my art piece called "Healing in Four Parts," which you'll get to see at the gallery on Friday. This artwork means a lot to me because when I was feeling sad, creating it made me feel much better. Art is an amazing tool – it's enjoyable and can help us feel better.

In my art piece, I used four different colors that are like my personal helpers for feeling better: green, pink, white, and blue. Green makes me think of nature and calmness, like being in a peaceful forest. Pink feels warm and kind, just like a hug from a friend. White is like a fresh start, helping me feel new again. And blue is soothing, like looking at the sky or the ocean. Maybe you have your own favorite colors that make you feel good.

You'll also notice a bright red shape in the artwork. It's like the heart of the piece. You could say I really put my heart into it! It reminds me that feeling better is a journey, and it's okay to show our feelings. Creating art, like my embroidery, is a way to take care of ourselves, understand our feelings, and feel better.



#### BLUEARTH








# **INQUIRY**


