FOUNDATION


We love getting to know all of our new students. The first full week has been busy and we have been spending lots of time learning about the routines and rules of our classroom and school.





YEAR 1

We have started the year off with some getting to know you activities and familiarising ourselves with our environment. Students have started literacy with a book 'Stellarphant' that was one of the shortlisted books for Book Week in 2022. We have been using the book in our Structured Literacy lessons to learn about Vocabulary, Sentences and Character Traits. We have also been doing some fine motor exercises to warm up our fingers for handwriting; throwing & catching, painting and cutting See photos In Maths we are practising counting by 2's and counting to 100. We have played card games and used our whiteboards to correctly form digits from 0 to 9. See photos At recess and lunch, we have enjoyed being back in the playground with our friends





YEAR 2

The Year 2 students have hit the ground running and have already achieved so much over the first week and a half of the term. I am very proud of their growth mindsets and enthusiasm for learning. We have been studying 'How to make a bird' in our structured literacy sessions and are focusing on the vocabulary in the story, comprehension, inference and sentence structure. The students have been responding to comprehension questions in a variety of ways. The students have already written and edited a Big Write for the term on 'I am me' and will be writing a 'Big Write' on the prompt 'Family' on Thursday. In Maths, we have been working on place value of numbers to 1,000 and have played a variety of Michael Minas maths games to practise our knowledge. All the JLC students thoroughly enjoyed getting back into LETI on Friday and the Year 2 students have stepped up as leaders, working with the younger students.







MIDDLE NEWS

Welcome back to the new school year. It has been a great start to the year with our new bunch of Year 3/4 students. We are looking forward to a great year of learning in the Middle Learning Community!

It was wonderful to see lots of our children and families at Cundy Park last night to welcome in the school year.


Well done to our students for consistently bringing along water bottles and wearing hats.

SENIOR NEWS

Welcome back to the New Year everyone. This year in the SLC, the homeroom teachers are Mrs Jackson, Miss Wall and Ms Lamb will be working with the students in tutoring and sometimes releasing teachers for planning. Mr Davis will have Homeroom Jackson on a Friday and Mrs Hancock will have Homeroom Wall on a Friday. The unit will, at times, work together on some subject areas such as Inquiry and Religion. The students have a diary for the year. This will be used to communicate to parents, reminders for students to bring or complete things, this is to help with organization of their time.

The curriculum we will be covering this term we will include - INQUIRY - AUSTRALIAN HISTORY

In relation to colonial Australia and its impact, students will explore, identify and describe change and continuity, the causes and effects of change in society, and they will compare the different experiences and perspectives of people in the past. This unit will prepare the students for their experiences at Sovereign Hill camp.

ENGLISH

We will be learning and deepening our understanding of sentence structure, nouns, verbs and adjectives. The students will be working on punctuation and looking at the spelling of words through learning about the morphology of the words. Much of our Inquiry information will be used as reading material in English.

MATHS

In Mathematics, the students will be working on place value; decimals through to millions, the writing and saying of large numbers, probability and interpreting graphs and data. We will have a particular focus on the students consolidating their times tables this term and encourage families to work on this together at home. The students have received a pack with Maths Mates for the term. They will be due each Thursday. Students can do these at any time however there are no excuses for not completing them. Should they misplace them, it is their responsibility to ask for a new one.

RELIGION

The topic for this term in Religion is The Church in Australia. This unit ties in neatly with our Australian History topic, covering the impacts of religion, life beliefs, struggles and triumphs. We will also be covering the indigenous perspective of Dreamtime.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

Mr Corcoran has worked through the Digital Technology Policy with the students. Although an exceptionally dry topic, it is important the students are aware of their responsibilities in regard to using technology in all its facets. The next step is for the students to work on their digital eSmart licenses. There will be no need for them to take iPads home this term as yet. Digital Technology can be one of the most challenging areas of the curriculum at times and we do not take the misuse of our digital platforms lightly, as adults we know too well the ramifications the misuse of the internet and technology can have.

HOMEWORK

Students will have received a Maths Mate pack and are to complete one each week, and these are due each Thursday morning. If your child is unable to complete a question please feel free to help them, however if you could circle that question it lets us know that this may be an area we can teach that week. It is ok to leave difficult or challenging questions if your child is stressing on it. If your child is happy to work through the Maths Mates on a rainy day that is fine, as long as they are at school by the Thursday morning of that week. We ask that the children choose a times table they are unsure of and master it. This could be for example, the seven times tables or the nine times.

CAMP

We will be going to Sovereign Hill, Ballarat for our camp this year, how exciting. Notes and permission forms have been uploaded to PAM, please read through these and make sure they have been signed. Naturally students are nervous about camp and we will continue to reassure them. We will have some Year 7 students chat to them about their time at Sovereign Hill. Just a note that all students will need black leather school shoes as part of their old school experience.

THANK YOU

Following the passing away of my mum, I would like to thank the amazing staff, who in the first week jumped in and kept my classroom running.
