

JUNIOR NEWS

Thank you to all families who made it to our parent teacher interviews last week. If you were unable to attend, please contact your child's teacher.

This term in LETI and Religious Education, the junior students will be focusing on the topic "All About Me" and "We grow in God's love" which celebrates all the wonderful things that make us unique and special. We will be working through the personal and social capabilities which help students identify and describe personal interests, skills and achievements and how these might contribute to school or family life.

Our key understandings are as follows:

- I am unique and there is no one like me.
- I have many talents and skills.
- Our families are all different and special. We come from different places.

We will look forward to sharing all of our investigations and work with you at the end of the term.

FOUNDATION

The Foundation students have been working hard on the initial learning of letters and sounds and the connection between letters, words and sentences. They have made an impressive start already, making words as a group.





Our religion topic is similar to our LETI topic, about how we are all special and unique. We took the opportunity to draw and paint selfies, which we can't wait to display in our classroom!



In maths this week, we are identifying 2D shapes and looking for them in the environment.

YEAR 1

In Literacy, Year 1 students have been working on sentence structure, handwriting and use of phonemic awareness skills. We have been using a book called the 'Very Hungry Giant' by Joy Cowley to investigate the use of nouns and verbs in sentences. In spelling, we have been learning about voiced and unvoiced sounds, this week is /th/ making the unvoiced 'th' sound as in 'thumb'.

In Maths, the students have continued to explore the place value of numbers to 100 and have been showing these numbers in various ways by modelling and writing and numbers using MAB.

Year 2

In Literacy Year 2 have continued to work on their sentence structure, handwriting and use of phonemic awareness skills in their reading and writing. In Maths, the students have continued to explore the place value of numbers to 1,000 and have been showing these numbers in various ways by writing, drawing and demonstrating numbers using MAB.

In Religion we are familiarising ourselves with our Catholic belonging. Mrs Bennett took us to the Church last week and explained all of the interesting details. This week Mrs Bennett took us to the Convent to visit the museum inside.



MIDDLE NEWS

We are settling into the daily routines in the MLC. It is great to see the students organising themselves on arrival for their learning.



Fluency Reading is taking place and the students are enjoying asking each other questions to ensure that they have comprehended the text.

SMART Spelling should be coming home for your child/ren to complete each night. This needs to be returned to school on Friday, prior to their SMART Spelling test. Challenge your child/ren to create a sentence using their spelling words or to simply air/sky write their words whilst saying the letters to you.



The students will be writing to persuade the educators to try their chosen sport, hobby or activity in their 'Big Write' this week. We will be looking for an introduction, at least 3 reasons and a conclusion.

We are covering a range of topics in Maths, including:

- Converting between millimeters, centimeters and meters and using a ruler to measure objects;
- Asking an information question, collecting, recording and presenting the data;
- Exploring the place and value of a multi-digit number; and
- Problem solving.



CSEF FLIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent,
 and:
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy; https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- · Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23 June 2023.
